May 4, 2018 "Promoting Best Practices with Epic: Grouped Order Sets, and Overview of Nursing Standards of Care Guidelines and the impact on Providers" Mary Dallas, MD, Chief Medical Information Officer Clinical Informatics, St. Charles Health System Objectives: 1) Introduce the concept of the OBSN and ANA guidelines for Nursing Standards of Care and articulate how the guidelines affect the daily workflow (how it relates to providers – what's different). This is now part of orders in our Epic build, and this is why. 2) What are the bells and whistles of order entry? How clinical decision support is used in order entry to improve patient safety. 3) How grouped orders in order sets helps with promoting best practices. Insulin may be used as an example by show how this order set design translates into practice for administering insulin at the bedside, and resulting outcomes with hypoglycemic events related to insulin dosing.

May 18, 2018 "Addressing Intimate Partner Violence with Patients" Jim Winkle, MPH Objectives: The educational objective to address this gap is: "Apply universal screening for IPV and appropriate interventions in order to reduce patient morbidity and mortality." 1) Utilize appropriate questions that screen for IPV. 2) Explore an increased clinical index of suspicion with patients. 3) Perform an adequate safety assessment, safety planning, and documentation. 4) Review the research on the paradoxical effect of increased intimate violence when screening programs were initiated.
