November 3, 2017 "Challenges of the Electronic Health Record, including Increasing Liability Claims" Sonny Nguyen, JD, RRT, CPHRM, Senior Director, Patient Safety & Risk Management, NW Region, The Doctors Company **Objectives:** 1) Realize that the EHR is at "two-edged sword" in that it both increases and decreases the risk of patient injuries, depending on how it is used by the user. 2) Appreciate that the claims of EHR-related patient injuries have more than doubled in the past 3 years. 3) Understand that it is a universal problem, on all medical specialties and locations where the EHR is utilized. 4) Inform how HER-related patient injury claims can be reduced, both personally as a user and collaboratively as a community of users.
